

The Nebraska Democratic Party County Chairs Caucus will conduct an election to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of the Nebraska Democratic Party's Vice Chair of County Parties. This positions' term ends on Nov. 4, 2026 (the day after the Nov. 2026 elections).

The election will be conducted at the March SCC meeting. A zoom option will be available for County Chairs to vote for the election of a new Vice Chair of County Parties.

Chair Kleeb will run the election on March 4 at 10:50am.

Each candidate can have one person nominate them with a one minute speech.

Each candidate will then have the opportunity to give a two minute speech.

NDP staff will count the votes using a raise hand function for current County Chairs present either in-person or on zoom. The winner will be the person with the majority of votes of those present (i.e. County Chairs) in-person and on zoom.

Anyone interested in running for this office and would like their name included in the Day of Agenda packet should email nominations@nebraskademocrats.org by March 4 (packet goes out at noon). Nominations will be permitted from the floor.



Anyone who wishes to become a candidate must meet the qualifications listed in the NDP Constitution and Bylaws.

- Cannot hold elected office other than a party office, run a political campaign for any office other than a party office, or run for office other than a party office during their terms.
- State Officers must be registered as Democrats and reside within the state.
- NOTE: While it is possible for the County Chairs Caucus to choose its officers from outside its membership, it must be noted that the Vice Chair of County Parties position was created in 2020 and was modeled after the ASDC (Association of State Democratic Committees). It is recommended that anyone seeking the office be either a County Chair or a Vice Chair. This is not a requirement, but is the intention behind this position so they can best represent county parties at the state level. At the 2024 State Convention, we will offer language to clarify this position–like all the other officer positions–on who is eligible to serve in the role.

Resolutions Committee Submissions: If you want to submit a resolution for consideration, please contact the Resolutions Chair Shirl Mora James by email platform@nebraskademocrats.org.

- NOTE: Any proposed resolution must be submitted to the Resolution Committee
 Chair 21-days ahead of the SCC meeting per the new rule passed at the State
 Convention in 2022.
 - The deadline for the March meeting was Feb 11th, 2023 at 5 p.m.
 - This gives the committee a chance to review all resolutions and for staff to get the resolutions into the 10-Day packet.
- The committee then reviews and votes on resolutions. The committee can take three actions.



- We can approve the resolution out of committee (as is or with some suggested edits) and bring it to the floor of the SCC for a vote. We will hand out the proposed resolutions for SCC consideration in a packet at the Registration desk (for online meetings they are included in the 10-day packet, and the day-of agenda).
- 2. We can reject a resolution and will inform the submitter of this decision. An SCC member can then bring the resolution to the floor with a majority vote of the body to hear the resolution.
- 3. We can recommend the resolution to a committee for the State Convention.

Tips and Tricks for Submitting a Resolution to the NDP:

- Research the resolution's topic. Make sure what you want to propose does not conflict with the Platform and other passed Resolutions.

- Write your resolution to be free of spelling and grammatical errors. Shorter resolutions are better. Whereas paragraphs should be descriptions. The resolved paragraph sets out the actions you want taken.
- The Platform Committee needs to receive a writable document (non-PDF, non-hard copy) sent to one or both designated email addresses, even if the resolution comes from the floor.
- Please be sure to designate who will present the resolution and speak in favor of it, if you are unable to attend the meeting.
