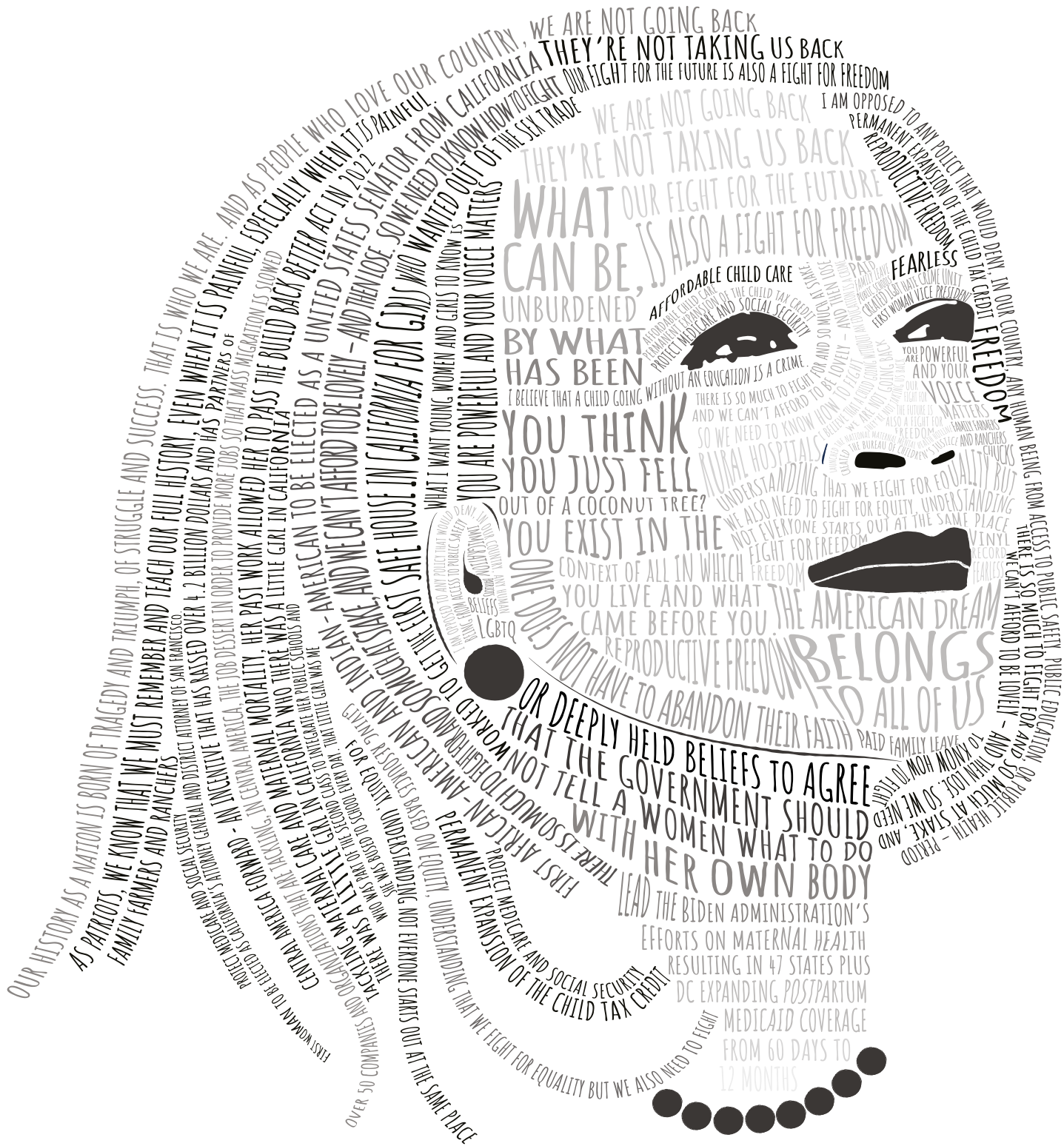

Folks, we have a new Democratic nominee for president – Kamala Harris! And during the next couple of months we will echo her message, “We are not going back!”

President Joe Biden announced on July 21 that he would no longer seek the Democratic bid, instead endorsing Vice President Harris. Biden is passing the torch to a new generation, one prepared to inspire, lead and continue doing the things that will be Biden’s legacy. As he said, “I revere this office, but I love my country more”

We are so grateful for all he has done, and we are also grateful he has passed the torch to Vice President Harris, who can champion the Biden-Harris accomplishments against Trump’s divisive rhetoric and extremist

Project 2025.

So, a little background on Kamala Harris. When she served as San Francisco’s District Attorney, she tackled violent crime head on, securing convictions in more than 87% of homicides and more than 90% of felony gun offenses.

As California attorney general, Harris took on corporations, making sure companies such as Google, Apple and Amazon displayed their privacy policies to ensure users knew where their data was going. Then-AG Harris also spent her time taking on tax cheats (including Big Oil), fraudsters and rapists, and she made sure justice was served. ## DEMOCRATIC INVESTMENTS ACROSS NEBRASKA

In 2020, the world was hit by a catastrophic virus that shut down production and distribution centers around the globe. Joe Biden took office in 2021, and jobs have returned, new jobs were created, and today, unemployment is at a historic low. Some prices of everyday necessities remain high, but the Biden-Harris administration has fought against corporate greed to ensure that families can make ends meet. We have successfully curbed inflation, and although not everyone’s wallet feels it in the checkout aisle yet, our economy has recovered from COVID better than any nation on earth.

Thanks to the Biden administration, all Nebraskans will soon have access to reliable high-speed internet. The CHIPS Act allowed for an investment of \$661.4 million for internet services alone, and another \$509.4 million for implementation and construction. Soon, Nebraskans from Kimball County to Cass County will have access to a strong internet connection and the ability to access information.

Nebraska’s 372,000 Medicare enrollees now have lower prescription drug prices regardless of income. The Biden-Harris Administration used the Inflation Reduction Act to allow Medicare and Medicaid to negotiate drug prices with companies – saving you and every other American money on health insurance. We are a party of the people, not the corporations. The Democratic plan to take on Big Pharma and allow



President Biden and Congress have worked together to pass bipartisan legislation to help support America’s families and create a path to improve the country’s infrastructure. Every dot on the map to the right represents significant amounts of funding that are available to Nebraska. The infrastructure plan has brought millions of dollars in resources to Nebraskans and provided unprecedented economic growth and recovery opportunities.

for affordable prescription drug prices will massively impact the lives of every American taxpayer for the better. That’s what happens when you fight for people over profits.

The Biden-Harris team invested \$256 million in Nebraska to guarantee clean water is delivered to homes and to improve the public water infrastructure system. An additional \$85.7 million has been allocated to replace lead pipes. Lead poisoning has been a long-standing problem, causing health issues for Nebraska families. While the lawmakers in our state may want to dismiss these issues, the Biden-Harris administration has fought to improve health care

for Nebraska’s families.

Our state also received \$233.4 million from this administration in grants and initiatives to invest in energy-efficient buildings. This historic investment signals a turn toward clean energy and ensures that the transition to clean energy is affordable for all involved. The Inflation Reduction Act allows for tax credits for corporations that transition to clean fuels, subsidies for states and grants for individual homeowners, helping at all levels in our fight against climate change.

Fighting for clean energy doesn’t stop at energy-efficient buildings. The Inflation Reduction Act also included almost \$20

million of investment in Nebraska’s electric vehicle infrastructure. This means there will be more charging stations, more efficient charging stations and publicly owned electric vehicles. It means your local school bus could be running on clean energy soon!

The Biden-Harris fight for working-class folks does not end with energy or drug prices. Thanks to the administration’s work on student loan relief, more than 15,300 Nebraskans have had more than \$742.8 million in student debt canceled. That means \$742 million in burden lifted off the back of Nebraskans. It means food on the table for some families, the

## VOTE BY MAIL APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Fill out the attached Vote By Mail application with your information and sign your name.
- Because of the new Voter ID law, voters must include identification on your application—you can write in your Nebraska driver's license or state ID number. You can also include a pic of another photo ID (see [VoterID.Nebraska.gov](https://VoterID.Nebraska.gov) for valid IDs). The ID can be expired.
- You can drop it off at your county election office. OR, you can email a picture to your county election office (find them in the list below).

**Starting on September 30th, your county election office sends you a ballot for the General Election.**

- When your ballot arrives, look up the Democratic candidates at [NebraskaDemocrats.org](https://NebraskaDemocrats.org).
- Follow all instructions on the ballot, sign the envelope, and send it back to arrive by November 5th. You can also drop it off at your county election office.

the faculty representative for the school's Gay-Straight Alliance. Walz said, "It really needed to be the football coach, who was the soldier and was straight and was married."

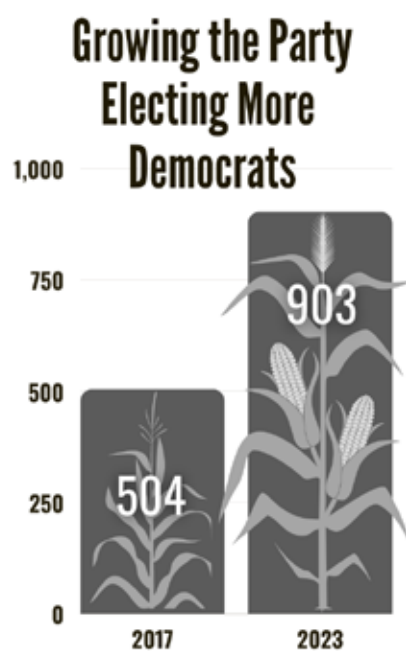
Compare this to the other side, as Governor Walz said on CNN, "They went right to division... they did not give us a plan on health-

"Doug got us lost and we ended up in Omaha," Walz said. "But we got a real break, sitting here in the Oklahoma section."

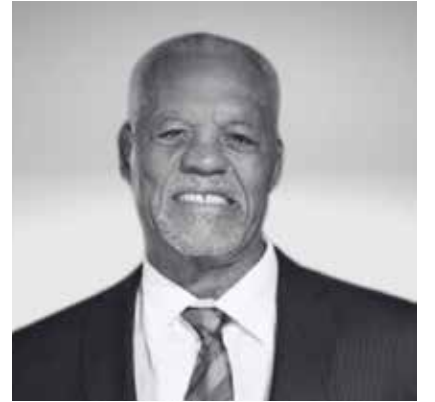

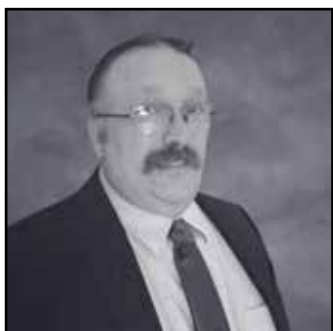

Younger voters have historically been critical to the Democratic Party, and we will continue to be crucial in the 2024 election, with candidates who will help save and restore our democracy.

Democrats have a strong vision for the future, including canceling student loan debt, combating climate change and slowing inflation. We have already taken steps toward canceling student loan debt, even while the efforts have been challenged by red states and struck down by the extreme Republican-majority Supreme Court. However, targeted programs such as SAVE, or Saving on a Valuable Education, erased the student loan debt of 4 million Americans. repeatedly blocked efforts to pass a bill doing that. In fact, in mid-July Senate Republicans blocked a bill that would have expressed support for abortion access. A Congress with a Democratic majority would ensure the codification of Roe, which a Democratic president would sign into law. These issues highlight why it is crucial to vote in national and local elections and restore a Democratic majority in the House and Senate. Nebraska candidates Carol Blood, Tony Vargas, Daniel Ebers, and Preston Love would make progress toward fulfilling these promises.

Republicans across the nation either deny the existence of climate change or block Democratic efforts to save our planet. Preston Love would facilitate the push for renewable energy, clean water and safe communities for all. Tony Vargas hopes to replace fossil fuels with renewable energy sources.

The ongoing Russia-Ukraine and Israel-Palestine conflicts are heated topics in the upcoming election. Democrats' handling of these situations is preferable to the GOP's vague promises and inaction. # COMBATting MISINFORMATION

With the news at our fingertips, it is more important than ever to be able to identify misinformation and disinformation. Not all “fake news” is an elaborate Russian plot; sometimes it’s your kooky neighbor posting a conspiracy theory. But if people do not have access to the truth, the validity of our elections and our very democracy may be undermined.

Nebraska is not immune to Republican talking points of rampant voter fraud, voting machines that rig the election and other baseless conspiracy theories. Democrats aren’t rigging elections or cheating to win; we just have popular ideas and Republicans refuse to accept a loss with any amount of grace.

So, how can we both avoid misinformation in our news feed and fight back when we see it?

Misinformation, when accepted by the masses, can alter elections. We saw this in 2020, when Russian bots tried to use their influence on American social media. This time around, it may not be as clear cut as bots with usernames like “republicanluvr4545,” but it is still important to be vigilant.

## How to avoid misinformation

- Location, location, location. I mean, sources, sources, sources. Check the validity of your sources, people! If the website looks sketchy or biased, it’s probably sketchy and biased! Only share trusted, provable sources with other individuals.

- Do your research! Look up the author of an article. See what they’re notable for, what they have written in the past and how they got a platform.

- Cross-reference your articles! If you see a piece of information in only one place, don’t trust it! But if multiple, reputable sources are talking about it, it is more

trustworthy. Seek out multiple forms of confirmation before sharing!

- Dates! If an article is from 2018 and has to do with 2018, don’t share it in 2024. Spreading out-of-date information can lead to confusion; always look up the most recent updates on a scenario before sharing it further.

- One man’s joke is another man’s information. Be aware of satire, parodies and jokes. People love to make jokes about the news, but when your random friends and family make a joke about a situation, do some more research before spreading the info.

## Don’t fret!

With the emergence of AI, Elon ruining Twitter and the 24-hour news cycle, misinformation can be hard to decipher from the real stuff!

The formula to combating it is simple: Trust your gut, and trust those who are trustworthy.

If a website is sketchy, don’t trust it. If a story is unverifiable and came from an account with 12 followers, don’t trust it.

NPR, the Associated Press, Reuters, the BBC, PBS, the New York Times, etc., all have track records of verifiably breaking news. Trust the household names!

The last note is this: Don’t blindly trust. Much misinformation is from the right, but not every Democratic source is trustworthy. If we want to call out the Republicans on their BS, we cannot stoop to their level and peddle misinformation and conspiracy theories.

Stay vigilant, folks. Only by spreading the good record of the Democrats will we win in November. Hate won’t win, lies won’t prevail and misinformation will not have a stranglehold on our great democracy.

# OUR VALUES AND OUR ACTIONS

A platform is a reflection of our values. We, as Democrats, build everything upon this platform, these core values by which we operate. ## AGRICULTURE

While Republicans claim to support family farms and ranches, they have continually opened the door for land-grabs via eminent domain, they have also backed large corporations and left family farmers to shoulder huge financial burdens for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs) with little oversight or protections.

Democrats have made strides to protect the little guy. From Biden’s executive order on Right to Repair, to giving more funding to land owners who voluntarily conserve their land, to stopping the land grab of the Keystone XL pipeline and fighting alongside you to stop eminent domain for private gain. We have delivered for our ag community and will continue to!

## EDUCATION

Republicans have encouraged the abuse of educators via online attacks, constant badgering in public forums, and sowing distrust among parents. They advocate for taking education out of the hands of educated professionals and putting it in the hands of the loudest most extreme parent in each district. They have launched a coordinated attack against freedom of religion by demanding that the christian religion be displayed and taught in public schools violating separation of church and state, and they are forcing taxpayers to fund religious education.

Democrats have teachers’ backs and have been supporting them for decades. We believe that education professionals are the best ones to make age appropriate curriculum decisions for the collective while staunchly defending the rights of parents to direct the education of their own children. We have stood by students, community members, and librarians to oppose book bans and infringements on freedom of speech.

## HEALTHCARE

Republicans have spent the last few years restricting what healthcare we can access, restricting what doctors can say (or forcing them to give untrue information to patients) and denying science. They claim to want all Americans to have access to healthcare but they attempted to repeal the ACA with no replacement. They also oppose access to birth control.

Democrats have been expanding healthcare coverage and making insurance through the marketplace more affordable. We work to keep rural health centers in operation and encourage evidence based public health measures. Biden lowered insulin costs for Seniors and has capped the total cost that seniors pay out of pocket each year on medication.

## IMMIGRATION

The only plan the Republicans have for immigration is to be cruel. Their plan outlined in Project 2025 is to create detention centers for 12 million immigrants who literally make the American economy work. They support the deportation of undocumented immigrants and detention camps resulting in families being split up. Republicans oppose protections and pathways to American citizenship for undocumented immigrants brought into the U.S. as children.

Democrats have a plan to not only increase border security but to provide a path to legal citizenship for those who want to become Americans. They back comprehensive reform of current immigration policies, underscoring the importance of humane and just treatment of immigrants. Democrats work to reform temporary work visas that protect both American workers and immigrants, while also focusing on family reunification.

## UNIONS

Republicans have encouraged freeloaders, participated in union busting, made it difficult to enforce collective bargaining agreements, silenced workers and restricted the freedom to join unions. They support efforts to make unions less effective and regulated, such as Right-to-Work laws. Republicans hope to limit collective bargaining rights, which results in diminished labor regulations that protect workers, especially blue-collar workers.

Democrats believe in unions and collective bargaining. We protect workers’ rights. In 2023, Biden became the first sitting president to join UAW workers on the picket line. We support policies that reduce barriers to joining unions. Democrats’ support for unions upholds and improves labor regulations like raising the minimum wage, ensuring equal pay and protecting workers from discrimination and exploitation.

### Carol Blood

LD 3 - Sarpy County  
Omaha Sen. Carol Blood understands the financial hardships health care can place on Nebraskans, and she passed a bill to increase access to and utilization of colorectal cancer screenings. She also passed a bill to support military spouses by easing their transition into the Nebraska workforce.



### Machaela Cavanaugh

LD 6 - Omaha  
Sen. Machaela Cavanaugh, focused on health care and sexual assault survivors. She was able to secure reimbursement for health care translation services to improve patient care. She also passed legislation improving the maintenance of sexual assault kits, giving survivors more information and control over their cases.



### Tony Vargas

LD 7 - Omaha  
Sen. Tony Vargas passed the Opioid Prevention and Treatment Act to ensure that overdose information reported cannot be used for criminal investigation or prosecution, encouraging EMS providers to report incidents without fear of legal repercussions. It provides training for first responders, supports overdose fatality review teams and funds behavioral health authorities and local public health departments. The bill also emphasizes research on opioid addiction and the tracking of overdose data.



### Megan Hunt (NP)

LD 8 - Omaha  
Sen. Megan Hunt continues to fight for Nebraskans struggling with drug dependence, providing them access to treatment with her priority bill to allow cities and counties in Nebraska to adopt Syringe Service Programs in an effort to combat the spread of diseases like HIV as well as reduce fentanyl and other opioid overdoses. Although the governor did veto the bill, Hunt believes it will be done someday and that it was a policy win for Nebraskans.



### John Cavanaugh

LD 9 - Omaha  
Sen. John Cavanaugh is another strong advocate for ensuring equity in our justice system. He ensured juveniles are treated with clear legal guidelines. He refined the application process for child support and modernized the State Electrical Act by aligning it with the latest national standards. He also created a transparent and accountable system for lotteries and raffles to ensure generated funds are used appropriately for the public's benefit.



### Wendy DeBoer

LD 10 - Omaha  
Sen. Wendy DeBoer fights to provide relief for Nebraskans. She standardized the process for property transfer at death, making it a smoother process for surviving spouses and families. She also focused on helping secure funding for the many protections and reforms she passed, including child care reimbursement, Alzheimer's and dementia advisory council and juvenile justice reform.



### Terrell McKinney

LD 11 - Omaha  
Sen. Terrell McKinney was able to allocate more than \$400 million to North and South Omaha, and \$30 million for small business development in North Omaha. He also established a statewide day of recognition for Malcolm X. McKinney reformed the parole and re-entry system, addressed high-poverty issues by offering legal representation in eviction proceedings and ensured fair treatment in housing agency hearings. He supported parents in the workforce by providing quality child care, and he banned hair discrimination in the workplace.



### Justin Wayne

LD 13 - Omaha  
Sen. Justin Wayne continues to improve rehabilitation for inmates, allowing correctional facilities to prioritize it and prepare inmates for successful reentry into society through increased mental health services and substance abuse treatment programs within prisons and expanding educational opportunities for successful reintegration into society. He also promoted economic growth and job creation with investment in Nebraska through economic development.



### Lynne Walz

LD 15 - Fremont  
Sen. Lynn Walz passed her priority bill creating funding for teaching computer science, scholarships for future special education teachers and professional development for computer teachers. She also worked to reduce teacher shortages, increase school security and improve access to special education and school psychologists. Walz improved Medicaid reimbursement, helping more dentists accept Medicaid patients, and she made crucial changes to retirement plans for firefighters serving in first-class cities.



### John Fredrickson

LD 20 - Omaha  
Sen. John Fredrickson secured quality child care assistance for Nebraska children and families, while also finding ways to provide Nebraskans quality physical and mental health care. He changed eligibility requirements for the federal child care subsidy to ensure services are accessible to eligible families. He also focused on enhancing public safety, ensuring professional competency and facilitating interstate practice for social workers.



### George Dungan

LD 26 - Lincoln  
Sen. George Dungan is proud of the Nebraska Prenatal Plus Program, which targets maternal and infant health, diabetes management and postpartum care. He also ensured property appraisers get proper education, and he passed the Nebraska Housing Agency Act to promote flexibility and potential growth in affordable housing.



### Anna Wishart

LD 27 - Lincoln  
Sen. Anna Wishart aimed to promote health equity, working on increasing access to mental health and substance use treatment and expanding capacity for comprehensive, holistic services to provide care for military members, veterans and individuals with Medicaid. She passed a bill to develop intergenerational family nursing homes and assisted living with child care, and appropriated funds for developmental disabilities.



### Jane Raybould

LD 28 - Lincoln  
Sen. Jane Raybould has recognized tribal groups and their sovereignty by permitting the use of tribal enrollment cards for certain firearm and alcohol laws as well as proof of age and identity. She provided for recognition of tribal mental health and dangerous sex offender commitment orders and transportation and commitment of persons civilly committed under tribal law.



### Eliot Bostar

LD 29 - Lincoln  
Sen. Eliot Bostar addressed campaign finance transparency for ballot initiatives. He improved consumer privacy rights related to genetic testing and changed child care licensing requirements to ensure quality child care. Bostar passed a bill to secure Nebraska and assess state or national security risks from other countries. His Line of Duty Compensation Act streamlined compensation claims for public safety officers and ensured sustainable funding for the State Patrol Retirement Fund.



### Danielle Conrad

LD 46 - Lincoln  
Sen. Danielle Conrad has diligently advocated for working families and civil rights. She removed barriers to workforce participation for military families and provided second-chance employment opportunities for those with past convictions. She ended school lunch debt collections and ensured mental illness counts as an excused absence. She expanded the homestead exemption to protect home equity, helped low-income Nebraskans fight evictions, strengthened open meetings and public records laws and created a free waterfowl hunting season for veterans.



### Jen Day

LD 49 - Sarpy County  
Sen. Jen Day continues to be a fighting voice for the women of Nebraska. She passed bills making breast pumps and lactation consultations more affordable for Nebraskans. She pushed the governor to opt into the Federal Summer EBT Program to feed hungry children, and she improved property tax exemptions, increasing financial relief by ensuring tax breaks are applied correctly and efficiently.

Your voice means so much to Nebraskans that are seeing their rights stripped away. Especially if an issue doesn't impact you directly, being an ally and having your voice amplifying those that are impacted makes a huge difference.

- Attend a rally.
- Attend a town hall.
- Attend a community meeting.
- Attend a board meeting (e.g. school, city council, county commission, public power, etc.).



## BE A VOTING CHEERLEADER

Research shows us that when neighbors talk to neighbors about issues important to them, people are more likely to vote.

- Encourage someone to register to vote.

- Explain the new voter ID rules or how to vote by mail to someone.
- Help a friend get an ID so they can vote.
  - ★ With the new Voter ID laws, it's important to ensure people know they need an ID to vote now. Some people may need childcare so they can visit the DMV, they may need a ride, or help to understand what paperwork they need or how to submit that paperwork.
- Volunteer to be a poll worker.
  - ★ Did you know that County Chairs are tasked with sending a list of poll workers for their party to the county clerk each year in February? Make sure your county chair knows you are interested in being a poll worker!

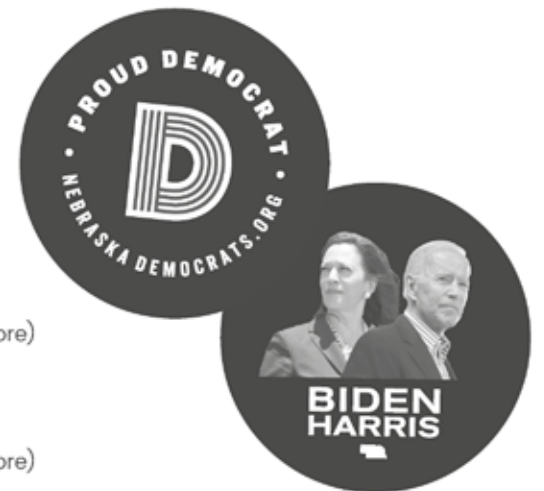
